sit and eat your treats while listening to stories or taking turns reading aloud together.

- After your child reads or you read, ask your child the following questions:

Who were the characters? Where did the story take place?
What was the problem in the story?

-Alphabet- Say an object and your child has to say what letter the object starts with and ends with.

Example: dog- starts with d end with g

Say a word, and have your child name as many words that rhymes with that word

Writing:

Do you have a pet? Write all about it. What is his or her name? What does he or she look like to do?
